## SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE



The recent report card results for the MCSD were not what we worked toward or expected. We are now just receiving the results from the 2014-2015 test results with approximately 15 weeks to go in the school year. This

runs counter to the purpose of assessment. The timing of the delivery of the results this school year does not allow time to make the adjustments in curriculum and instruction needed. The assessments have changed from the Ohio Achievement Assessments (OAA)/Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) in 2014 to the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC)/American Institute of Research (AIR)/OAA (3rd grade reading only)/OGT in 2015 to AIR in 2016. The 2015 accountability results were based on three different assessments each having their own text complexity and student expectations. The General Assembly (GA) responded with new legislation:

- *eliminated the PARCC due to the problems that occurred with administration of the assessments and the time required of students for testing;*
- *limited the length of time required for the tests; and*
- *held students and teachers harmless from the results of the assessments.*

Legislation passed by the GA calls to question the validity of the test results.

The target is constantly moving and makes it very difficult to hit. We accept the results and will continue to make strides as we continue to play by the rules established by the Federal Government, Ohio General Assembly and the Ohio Department of Education. The rules of the game will be changing once again with the passage of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The one constant in the changing world of education is that the Massillon City Schools will continue to do what's right for kids every day and work diligently to do so despite the constant change in federal and state accountability and assessments. Just like our children, the Massillon City School District is much more than an arbitrary grade!

# FOUNDATION OFFERING LOANS TO AREA GRADUATES

The Massillon Educational Loan Foundation is a non-profit organization established in 1947. The Foundation is offering student loans to high school graduates or college students in western Stark

County. Students graduating from Fairless, Jackson, Massillon, Perry, Northwest and Tuslaw Schools are eligible for these low interest loans. R.G. Drage graduates that are residents of any of these districts are

also eligible along with graduates of an accredited private school in one of the six districts.

Loans are awarded on a yearly basis for a maximum of \$2,000 per aca-

demic year with a maximum amount of \$8,000. Payments and interest on the loans are deferred until six months after graduation. There are no fees. For applications and additional information go to MELF.ORG.

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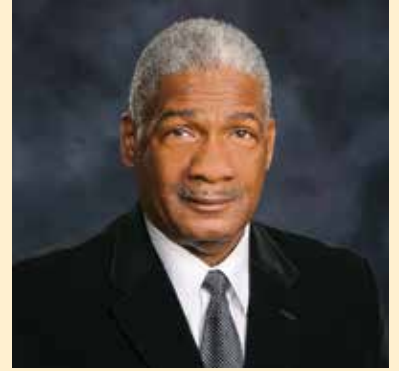

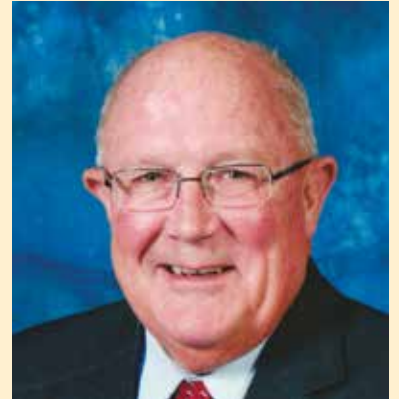

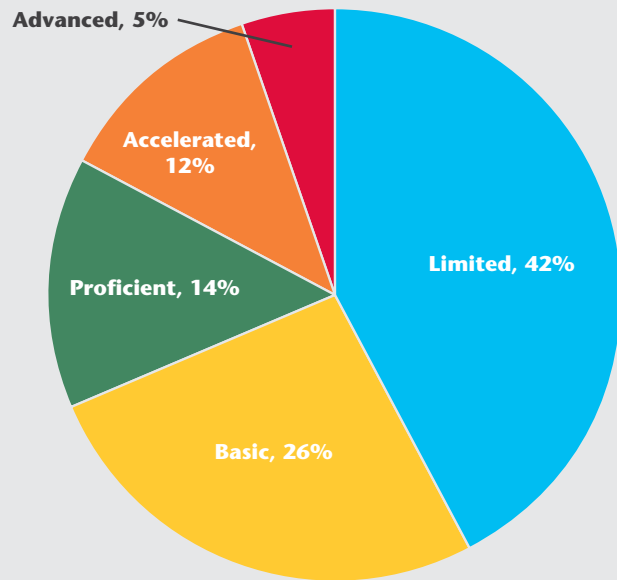

- First year of third grade testing results based on Ohio's more rigorous standards and student expectations
- Approximately 31% of Massillon City Schools' third graders met or exceeded the performance expected for students at the end of the third grade school year
- Students will be assessed again in April on the third grade reading standards



### Will Your Child Be Entering Third Grade Next Year? Here Are Some Helpful Third Grade Tips From The National PTA!

- Reading closely to find main ideas and supporting details in a story
- Describing the logical connection between particular sentences and paragraphs in stories (e.g., first, second, third; cause and effect)
- Comparing the most important points and key details presented in two books on the same topic
- Writing opinions or explanations that group related information and develop topics with facts and details
- Writing stories that establish a situation and include details and clear sequences of events that describe the actions, thoughts and feelings of characters
- Independently conducting short research projects that build knowledge about various topics
- Asking and answering questions about information he or she hears from a speaker or while participating in classroom discussions, offering appropriate elaboration and detail that build on what others have said
- Reading stories and poems aloud fluently, without pausing to figure out what each word means
- Distinguishing the literal and nonliteral meanings of words, such as something's fishy and cold shoulder
- Spelling correctly and consulting dictionaries to clarify meanings of words
